Luis-Miguel Muñoz Cárdaba was born in Vallelado, Segovia province (Spain), on August 25, 1965.

Graduated in Law from the Complutense University of Madrid, he was completed his education in the Major Seminary of Toledo and the Superior Institute of Theological Studies of San Ildefonso of the same city.

He was ordained as a priest on June 28, 1992 by Cardinal Archbishop of Toledo Don Marcelo González Martín, being incardinating in the Archdiocese of Toledo.

Sent to the Pontifical Spanish College in Rome to complete his formation, he obtained a Doctorate in Dogmatic Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University. Subsequently, he completed his Degree in Canon Law at the Pontifical University of the Holy Cross.

In 1994 he was called to collaborate with the Secretariat of State of Vatican. In 1999 he entered the Pontifical Ecclesiastical Academy and in 2001 he became part of the Diplomatic Service of the Holy See. Since then he has carried out his mission in the Apostolic Nunciatures of Greece, Mexico, Belgium, Italy, Australia, France and Turkey.

On March 31, 2020, Holly Father, Pope Francis, appointed him as Titular Archbishop of Nasai and Apostolic Nuncio in Sudan and Eritrea.
